REMEMBER

1. *It is the waste producer's obligation to correctly identify the waste*
2. *Under 'The Waste Regulations 2011' the waste producer has an obligation to apply the waste hierarchy - Reduce, Re-use, Recycle and Recover.*
3. *If the waste is not as described or contains materials listed in 'Hazardous materials' an additional charge may apply (at our absolute discretion)*

We are here to help. If you are in any doubt as to what you can put in your skip please contact our customer services team on 01392 826456.

Advice on loading the skip:

- Heavy material on the bottom
- Large wood pieces/plastic next
- Bagged material on top
- Do not fill over the sides of the skip

LOOSE IN SKIP:

- Plastic pipes
- Wood pieces
- Sub-soil
- Rubble
- Insulation board (whole/large pieces)
- Insulation rolls
- Tiles (without plaster/adhesive/backing)
- Paint tins - empty or with solidified paint in
- Porcelain sanitary ware
- Concrete, mortar, bricks, sand or gravel
- Mixed metals & cables
- Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (extra charges apply)
- Tyres (extra charges apply)

BAGGED (SEPERATELY)

- Slates/roof Tiles*
- Small pieces of plastic
- Small wood pieces
- Clear up waste (no more than 3 bags)
- Mastic & glue gun cartridges (empty)
- Small pieces of insulation board
- Loose/spare offcuts of insulation rolls
- Polystyrene
- Cardboard
- Garden waste/turf
- Paper (if possible)
- Packaging (if possible)
- Up to 1 small dumpy bag of gypsum (or 3 rubble sacks) on top of the load not exceeding 10% of skip

Asbestos Awareness

Typical materials that may contain asbestos are; man-made roof tiles, insulation boards, soffits, corrugated sheeting, old artex paint, down pipes and guttering – please see our separate guide for more information.

REMEMBER

Asbestos may be present in more than one material you may be handling. If in any doubt, have it tested, we can arrange this for you.

Asbestos in a skip renders the whole skip HAZARDOUS and means the whole skip has to be disposed of as Hazardous Waste.

* SLATES & ROOF TILES

To avoid any possible asbestos contamination roof tiles will only be accepted if they are clearly identified, bagged separately and certified as non asbestos. Testing can be provided.

Our customer services team must be informed if tiles or slates are to be collected. Containers with uncertified tiles will be re-classified as hazardous and extra charges will apply.

WHAT NOT TO PUT IN MIXED CONSTRUCTIONS AND DEMOLITION WASTE SKIP:

If any of these items are found to be in your skip you will be contacted. The skip may be re-classified to a General Waste or Hazardous code and extra charges may apply.

- Asbestos
- Railway sleepers
- Paint tins - containing liquid paint
- Full or semi-full mastic or glue cartridges
- Black bags of household general waste

ASBESTOS AWARENESS GUIDE:

If in doubt check it out!

For just £20 (exc VAT) we can send samples away for independent analysis to confirm if asbestos is present.

If you have small amounts of asbestos, double bag it and talk to our Customer Services Team who can talk you through charges and collections.

It will be significantly cheaper than contaminating your skip.



REMEMBER

Asbestos is a killer. We will not expect our staff to handle asbestos.

Be respectful and careful.

Do you know how much a skip contaminated with asbestos could cost you?

A 4 tonne skip contaminated with asbestos could cost you an additional £1,000+ (exc VAT).

Why? Because when a skip is contaminated it requires additional action and incurs additional costs including:

- Haulage to a licensed disposal site
- Disposal/gate fee
- Hazardous consignment note
